As the most abundant animals on the island, we take up a lot of room and resources. The good news is that we can share, and we can have habits that maintain the habitats of our fellow Statians.


In group 4, we focus on learning some of these animals that live on the island with us. To make it fun, use the images included to make a memory game.

COLOUR BY NUMBER


- * Provide each student with a copy of the following artwork

- * Ask them to start with number 1. Which colour is number 1? Find as many 1's as you can and colour them in. After a few minutes, move them unto number 2. Continue moving until you reach number 6. They can then fill in any numbers they have missed.
- * When they are done (or 5 minutes is left) ask them to tell you what they think they are colouring?
- * Ask 'who can tell me something fun about the hummingbird or the grasshopper?'
- * Explain that they were also born here, and their parents are from here, and their children will also be born here. Let us protect birds, insects and all the other Statian Wild Animals
